



WHAT'S ON **EXHIBITIONS AND VISITS**







Buckingham Palace serves as the official London residence of His Majesty The King.

It is one of the few working royal palaces remaining in the world today. Each summer, when the Palace is not being used in its official capacity, visitors can enjoy the magnificent State Rooms.

HIGHLIGHTS

PICTURE GALLERY

Designed as a setting for George IV's magnificent collection of Old Master paintings, the Picture Gallery at Buckingham Palace displays some of the finest works in the Royal Collection. The hang is changed regularly, as the Monarch lends many paintings to exhibitions around the world. Artists represented include Vermeer, Rembrandt, Van Dyck, Rubens, Titian, Canaletto and Claude.



WHITE DRAWING ROOM

Among the most beautiful of the Palace's State Rooms, the White Drawing Room is a symphony of white and gold. Incorporated into the room's design is a concealed door, allowing members of the Royal Family to enter and leave the State Rooms discreetly




BALLROOM

Queen Victoria ordered the construction of the enormous Ballroom, the largest room in the Palace. Originally named the 'Ball and Concert Room', it opened in 1856 with a ball to celebrate the end of the Crimean War. The Ballroom has been at the centre of official entertaining ever since and is still used today for State Banquets and Investitures.

THRONE ROOM

The dramatic arch and canopy in this room are the work of the architect John Nash and were greatly influenced by his background in theatre design. Central to the room is the pair of throne chairs which were used for the Coronation ceremony of Queen Elizabeth II and The Duke of Edinburgh. The room has also been used as the backdrop for royal wedding photographs.

THE STATE ROOMS AND **GARDEN HIGHLIGHTS TOUR**

Combine a visit to the State Rooms with a guided walking tour of the famous Palace garden.

The Garden Highlights Tour explains the history of the garden, taking you to the beautiful Herbaceous Border, the wisteria-clad summer house. Rose Garden, the enormous Waterloo Vase and the Palace tennis court, where King George VI and Fred Perry played in the 1930s Between the multimedia tour of the State Rooms and the guided tour of the garden, the itinerary allows time for your group to enjoy tea and cakes from the Garden Café and to visit the Garden Shop.

HIGHLIGHTS

THE DIAMOND JUBILEE STATE COACH

This beautiful coach was first used at the State Opening of Parliament in 2014. Its interior incorporates items donated by over 100 of Britain's historic sites and organisations, including the Royal Yacht Britannia, Canterbury Cathedral and 10 Downing Street. The gilded crown on top of the coach, carved of oak from HMS Victory, includes a camera to film the coach's journey and the crowds lining the streets.



THE CARRIAGE **HORSES**

During your visit you may see some of His Majesty's horses that draw the coaches and carriages housed at the Mews. The Cleveland Bays are used to escort newly appointed High Commissioners and Ambassadors to their audience with The King while the Windsor Greys pull the coaches and carriages carrying the Royal Family on State and ceremonial occasions.



Undoubtedly the most dazzling vehicle at the Royal Mews is the Gold State Coach, which was built for George III in 1762 and most recently played a starring role in the Platinum Jubilee celebrations in 2022. As its name suggests, the surface of the coach is covered almost entirely in real gold leaf. It weighs almost four tonnes, requires eight horses to pull it, and has carried every monarch to

of coaches and carriages.

It has played an important role in many

memorable State and ceremonial occasions,

such as Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation,

royal weddings and Trooping the Colour.

Today the Royal Mews provides a unique

opportunity for visitors to see the work of the

Royal Household department that provides

road transport for The King and members

of the Royal Family by both horse-drawn

carriage and car. The Mews is also home

to Windsor Greys and Cleveland Bays,

the horses that pull the royal carriages.


WINDSOR CASTLE

Windsor Castle is the oldest and largest occupied castle in the world.

Established in the 11th century by William the Conqueror, it has been remodelled by successive kings and queens, including Edward III, Charles II and George IV. Today the Castle is used regularly for ceremonial and State occasions and has been the home of 40 monarchs.

HIGHLIGHTS



THE STATE **APARTMENTS**

A walk through the State Apartments takes you on a journey through 1,000 years of royal history, from the medieval origins of the Castle to the present day. Many of these magnificent rooms were built for Charles II and are today the setting for State and ceremonial occasions.

ST GEORGE'S **CHAPEL**

St George's Chapel is one of the finest examples of Gothic architecture in England. It is the spiritual home of the Order of the Garter and the final resting place of eleven monarchs, including Henry VIII, Charles I, Queen Elizabeth II and her husband Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.



QUEEN MARY'S DOLLS' HOUSE

The largest and most famous dolls' house in the world was built by the British architect Sir Edwin Lutyens and no detail was omitted. The house has a fully stocked wine cellar, flushing toilets, running water and working lifts, and is filled with thousands of objects made by the leading artists, designers, craftsmen and manufacturers of the time.

CHRISTMAS

The Castle is decked with Christmas trees, garlands, and twinkling lights for the festive season. This is a wonderful time of year to see Windsor, and a visit to the Castle is the perfect way for groups to celebrate.

GROUP VISIT

Whether your interest is in fine art, architecture or history, Windsor Castle offers an extraordinarily varied day out all on one site.

The State Apartments are furnished with some of the finest works from the Royal Collection, including paintings by Rubens, Van Dyck and Holbein, Sèvres porcelain and exquisite English and French furniture.

From October to March, you can also enjoy the richly decorated Semi-State Rooms, which were George IV's private apartments and are still used for official entertaining.

Your ticket also includes St George's Chapel, one of the most beautiful ecclesiastical buildings in England and the final resting place of II monarchs including Henry VIII, Charles I and most recently Queen Elizabeth II.

QUEEN MARY'S DOLLS' HOUSE -PRIVATE TALK AND VIEW



Together with hundreds of household objects, each reproduced at a 1:12 scale, the house features working lifts, electric lighting and running water. Its library contains tiny books specially written by the greatest authors of the day. This dolls' house was never intended for children but instead to showcase the best of British art and design after the First World War. For the first time, Groups will explore the story of the house, its contents, and how modern conservators meticulously care for this world in miniature, followed by a private viewing without the crowds.

OUEEN ELIZABETH II'S LIFE AT THE CASTLE – PRIVATE TALK

Windsor remained a constant in the Queen's life; through childhood, war and 70 years on the throne.

The Castle served as a stage for the great events of the Queen's reign and as a focus for her leadership of the Church of England, the Armed Forces, the Order of the Garter and other aspects of national life.

At the same time, Windsor was a peaceful refuge in which to raise a family; a place to ride horses with children and great-grandchildren and to enjoy many other private moments that made the Castle her favourite weekend home.

Groups will gain new insights into the function of Windsor Castle and how it shaped the Queen's life.

The Palace of Holyroodhouse is Edinburgh's Royal Palace, His Majesty The King's official residence in Scotland, and stands at the foot of the Royal Mile against the spectacular backdrop of Arthur's Seat.

It has been a royal residence for over 500 years and is closely associated with Scotland's rich history.

MARY, QUEEN **OF SCOTS**

Follow in the footsteps of Mary, Queen of Scots, one of Scotland's most famous and fascinating historical figures, on a visit to the Palace of Holyroodhouse.

The daughter of lames V, Mary came to live at Holyroodhouse in 1561. She married both of her Scottish husbands at the Palace, and witnessed the murder of her secretary, David Rizzio, at the hands of a group led by her jealous husband, Lord Darnley.

Groups can visit Mary's Bedchamber, described as 'the most famous room in Scotland', and her Outer Chamber, where she met with Protestant cleric John Knox.

On the night that she witnessed David Rizzio's brutal murder, Mary was six months pregnant with the future lames VI. A 'bloodstain' on the floor in the Outer Chamber allegedly marks the spot where Rizzio's body was left.

The spectacular Darnley Jewel, on display in the Outer Chamber. is one of the most important early jewels in the Royal Collection.

BONNIE PRINCE CHARLIE

Bonnie Prince Charlie brought the Palace to life in 1745, when he set up court for six weeks as he attempted to claim the British throne for his father. You can see the Great Gallery where the Prince held extravagant balls and receptions, and the sumptuous bed in which he may have slept, which remains in Lord Darnley's

THE PALACE **GARDENS AND ABBEY**

Throughout the year you can explore the Palace gardens, set against the spectacular landscape of Arthur's Seat, and the setting for the annual Garden Party, held in July for around 8,000 guests.

You can also view Holyrood Abbey's romantic ruins next to the Palace, and learn about the building's extraordinary history as part of a self-guided visit.

A new public garden based on the earliest recorded gardens at the Palace opened in 2020. A flowering meadow of medicinal plants evokes the 15th-century monastic gardens of Holyrood Abbey while geometric flowerbeds reflect the design of 17th-century gardens. Raised beds filled with herbal, medicinal and culinary plants reimagine the physic garden established in the Palace grounds 350 years ago, the first of its kind in Scotland.

HOW TO PAY

Group visit prices apply to 15 people or more. Special and Private Visit group sizes vary. Groups are encouraged to reserve and book in advance via the Royal Collection Trust website or by telephone.

Pre-booked group reservations must be paid for 30 days prior to the day of the visit or when booking. Bookings made within 30 days are subject to availability and must be paid for at the time of enquiry. The Buckingham Palace Garden Highlights Tour must be booked and paid for 30 days before the visit.

PAYMENT METHODS

On-the-day group bookings: by cash, credit card or debit card. Group reservations: by credit card over the telephone or by posting a company cheque with two signatures. Company cheques should be made payable to 'Royal Collection Enterprises Limited'.

We accept the following credit and debit cards: Visa, MasterCard, American Express, JCB and Switch/ Maestro. We do not accept payment by BACS transfer.

PLANNING A VISIT

COACH PARKING

London – There is no dedicated coach parking at Buckingham Palace, The Queen's Gallery or the Royal Mews. Once your booking is confirmed, we will advise you of the nearest set-down and pick-up points.

Windsor Castle – Pay-and-display parking is available on Alma Road in the town centre and is clearly signed from all approach routes. A lift takes visitors from the Coach Park to Windsor Royal Station, approximately a ten-minute walk to the Castle entrance. Coaches cannot set down or pick up passengers at the entrance to Windsor Castle.

Palace of Holyroodhouse – For groups purchasing tickets to the Palace, coach set-down, pick-up, and limited free parking is available adjacent to the Palace on Abbey Hill. Coach drivers may also enjoy complimentary tea and coffee, but then must remain with their vehicle for the duration of the visit. Alternative pay-and-display coach parking is available on nearby Regent Road.

FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography and filming (for private use only) and the use of mobile phones are permitted in outdoor areas but not inside the buildings, except at the Royal Mews, the Palace of Holyroodhouse and The Queen's Galleries. Wedding photography is not permitted at any of the sites.

GROUP LEADERS AND GUIDES

At the Palace of Holyroodhouse, one group leader will receive free admission when accompanying a group of 15 people or more.

At all sites Blue Badge Guides receive free admission, subject to availability, when they present their credentials.

At all sites, only Royal Collection Trust-authorised Blue Badge Guides are permitted to guide in designated areas. No guiding is permitted inside the buildings.

TIMING AND SECURITY

Admission to our sites, especially Windsor Castle, is busiest immediately after opening and throughout the morning. Arrival after midday is recommended, especially during the summer and on public holidays. We operate timed ticketing at all sites, excluding the Palace of Holyroodhouse. It is essential to pre-book your visit to guarantee entry at your preferred time.

Prior to entry, visitors and their belongings are subject to airport-style security checks. Please assist us in reducing the time taken for security procedures by asking your group to arrive with as few bags and bulky items as possible and by encouraging them to leave these items on the coach or at their hotel.

REFRESHMENTS

Buckingham Palace – The Garden Café offers a selection of hot and cold drinks, sandwiches, cakes, and ice cream, available to State Rooms ticket holders only.

Windsor Castle – The Undercroft Café offers freshly prepared meals, including sandwiches, wraps and salads. Canned water is also available at the Castle shops.

Palace of Holyroodhouse – The Café at the Palace offers a range of hot and cold refreshments and lunch. Groups may reserve a seating area or pre-order take-away food. Dietary requirements for special and private tours should be communicated in advance. Please telephone +44 (0)131 652 3685 for further details.




