## PLANNING A VISIT

### Closures

As the official residences of The King are working royal palaces, opening arrangements may change at short notice. Before visiting, please check [www.rct.uk/ttg](http://www.rct.uk/ttg) or telephone +44 (0)303 123 7321.

### Group leaders and guides

At all sites, registered Blue Badge Guides receive complimentary admission, subject to availability, when they present their credentials on the day of their visit.

For sites in London and Windsor, Blue Badge Guides must book their complimentary visit in advance by registering with us. Please email [specialistsales@rct.uk](mailto:specialistsales@rct.uk) for more information.

At the Palace of Holyroodhouse, one group leader, who is not a registered Blue Badge Guide, will receive complimentary admission when accompanying a group of 15 people or more.

Guiding is only permitted in designated outdoor areas, and only Windsor Accredited Guides can guide in the Precincts at Windsor Castle. No guiding is permitted inside the buildings across sites.

### Access

Concessionary rates are available for visitors with disabilities, and access companions are admitted free of charge with a paid ticket when booked directly with us. A range of access resources,

including mobility aids, are available depending on the site. Please note that for the State Rooms at Buckingham Palace, step-free access must be pre-booked in advance by contacting [specialistsales@rct.uk](mailto:specialistsales@rct.uk).

### Photography and Filming

Photography and filming (for private use only) and the use of mobile phones, are permitted in outdoor areas but not inside the buildings, except at the Royal Mews and The King's Galleries. Wedding photography is not permitted at any of the sites.

### Coach parking

**London** – There is no dedicated coach parking at Buckingham Palace, The King's Gallery or the Royal Mews. Once your booking is confirmed, we will advise you of the nearest set-down and pick-up points.

### Windsor Castle

Pay-and-display parking is available on Alma Road in the town centre and is clearly signed from all approach routes. A lift takes visitors from the Coach Park to Windsor Royal Station, approximately a ten-minute walk to the Castle entrance. Coaches cannot set down or pick up passengers at the entrance to Windsor Castle.

### Palace of Holyroodhouse

Coach set-down, pick-up, and limited free parking is available adjacent to the Palace on Abbey Hill. Alternative pay-and-display coach parking is available on nearby Regent Road.

### Timing and security

Windsor Castle is busiest immediately after opening and throughout the morning. Arrival after midday is recommended, especially during the summer and on public holidays. We operate timed ticketing at all sites, excluding the Palace of Holyroodhouse.

It is essential for groups to pre-book their visit in advance, which also guarantees your preferred entry time at sites where timed-ticketing is in operation.

Prior to entry, visitors and their belongings are subject to airport-style security checks. Please assist us in reducing the time taken for security procedures by asking your group to arrive with as few items as possible.

### Refreshments

A selection of hot and cold refreshments is available to visitors across the royal palaces, including the Garden Café at Buckingham Palace, the Undercroft Café at Windsor Castle and the Café at the Palace at the Palace of Holyroodhouse.

### Shopping

Guidebooks may be purchased at the time of booking, and a wide range of exclusive merchandise, exhibition catalogues and books about the royal residences and art collection are available from Royal Collection Trust shops at each site.

# BUCKINGHAM PALACE

Buckingham Palace serves as the official London residence of His Majesty The King. It is one of the few working royal palaces remaining in the world today. Visitors can explore the magnificent State Rooms when the Palace is open each summer.



## HIGHLIGHTS

### Picture Gallery

Designed as a setting for George IV's collection of Old Master paintings, the Picture Gallery at Buckingham Palace displays some of the finest works in the Royal Collection. Artists represented include Vermeer, Rembrandt, Van Dyck, Rubens, Titian, Canaletto and Claude. The paintings are amongst the objects that The King lends to exhibitions around the world.

### Throne Room

Central to the room is the pair of throne chairs which were made for Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip in 1953, then reupholstered and used during the Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla. The room has been used as the backdrop for royal photographs, most recently as the setting for the official portraits following the Coronation of Their Majesties The King and Queen.

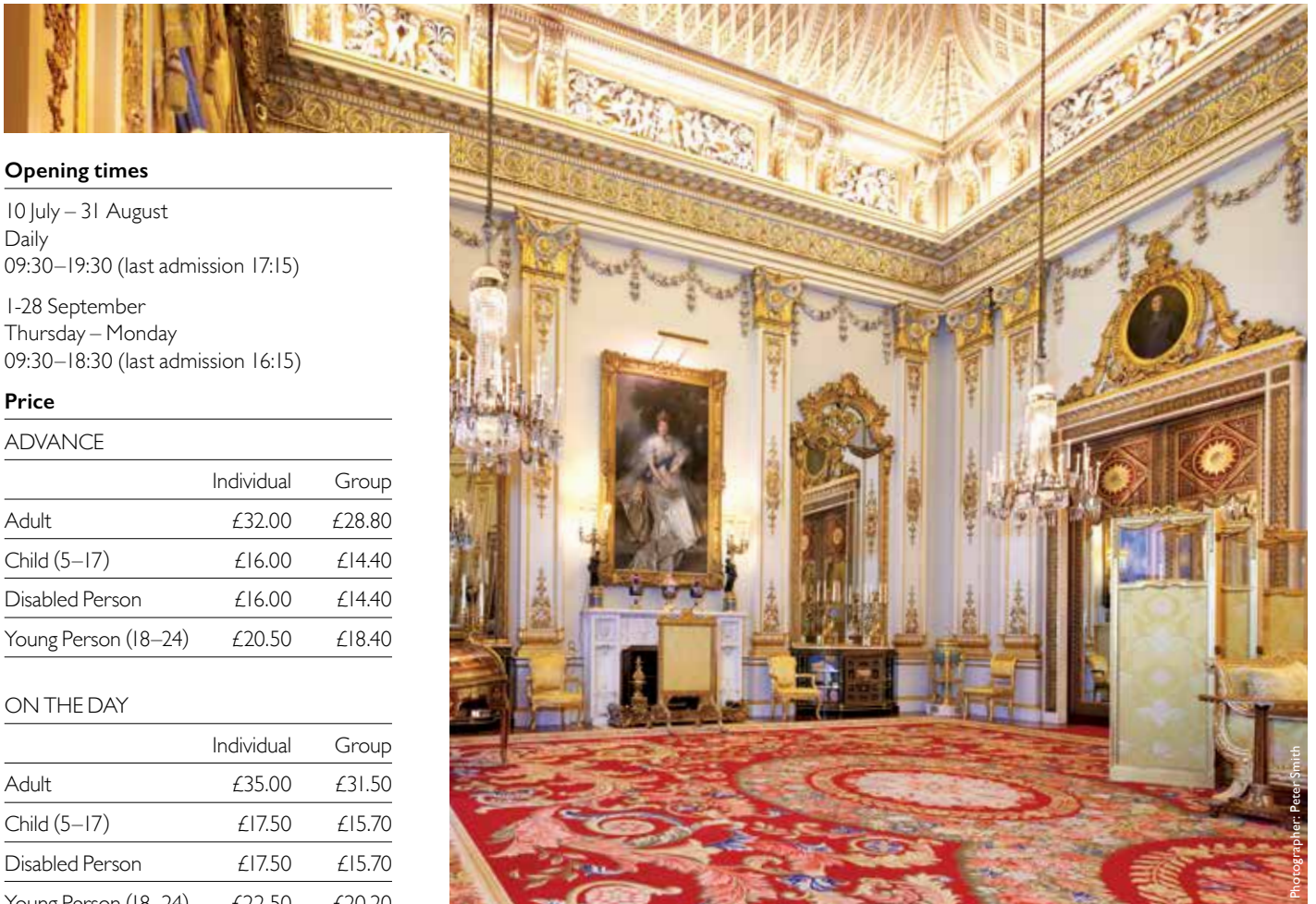
### White Drawing Room

The White Drawing Room is perhaps the most beautiful of all the State Rooms. The room includes a concealed door, allowing members of the Royal Family to enter and leave the State Rooms discreetly from the private areas beyond.

### Ballroom

Queen Victoria ordered the construction of the Ballroom. Originally named the 'Ball and Concert Room', it opened in 1856 with a ball to celebrate the end of the Crimean War. Today, the Ballroom is still used for entertaining such as State Banquets.

**THE STATE ROOMS AND GARDEN HIGHLIGHTS TOUR**

Combine a visit to the State Rooms with a guided walking tour of the famous Palace garden.

The Garden Highlights Tour explores the history of the garden. Groups will discover a beautiful herbaceous border, the wisteria-clad summer house, rose garden and the Palace tennis court, where King George VI and Fred Perry played in the 1930s. The itinerary allows time for groups to enjoy tea and cakes from the Garden Café and to visit the Garden Shop.

# THE ROYAL MEWS

## BUCKINGHAM PALACE

The Royal Mews is one of the finest working stables in existence. Now 200 years old, the Mews remains the home of all road travel arrangements for The King and members of the Royal Family, from horse-and-carriage to car and from livery to harness.



### HIGHLIGHTS

#### The Gold State Coach

The most dazzling vehicle at the Royal Mews is the Gold State Coach, used at every Coronation since that of William IV. Queen Elizabeth II used it to travel on her Coronation Day in 1953, it appeared as part of the Platinum Jubilee Pageant in celebration of her 70-year reign, and most recently it was used at the Coronation of King Charles III in 2023. As its name suggests, the surface of the coach is covered almost entirely in real gold leaf.

#### The Diamond Jubilee State Coach

Built to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee, this coach has only ever conveyed the sovereign. This is the newest coach at the Mews and was first used at the State Opening of Parliament on 4 June 2014. Its interior incorporates items donated by over 100 of Britain's historic sites and organisations, including the Royal Yacht Britannia, Canterbury Cathedral and 10 Downing Street.

#### The Carriage Horses

During a visit to the Royal Mews, visitors may see some of His Majesty's horses that draw the coaches and carriages. The Cleveland Bays are used to escort newly appointed High Commissioners and Ambassadors to their audience with The King, while the Windsor Greys pull the coaches and carriages carrying the Royal Family on State and ceremonial occasions.

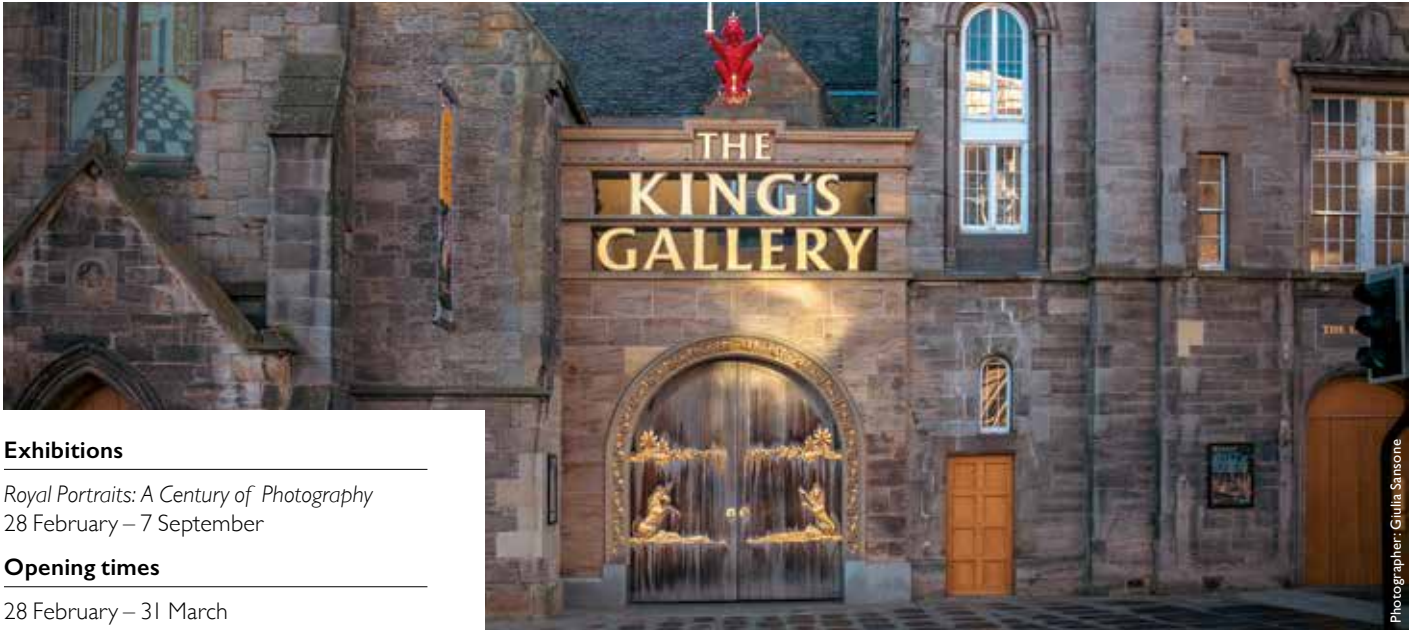

# PALACE OF HOLYROODHOUSE

The Palace of Holyroodhouse is Edinburgh's Royal Palace and The King's official residence in Scotland.

Home to 900 years of Scottish royal history, it stands at the foot of the Royal Mile against the spectacular backdrop of Arthur's Seat.

## HIGHLIGHTS

### Mary, Queen of Scots

The daughter of James V, Mary came to live at Holyroodhouse in 1561. She married both of her Scottish husbands at the Palace, and witnessed the murder of her secretary David Rizzio. Groups can visit Mary, Queen of Scots' Bedchamber, described as 'the most famous room in Scotland'.

### The Palace at Christmas

Celebrate the festive season as a group at the Palace of Holyroodhouse. The Palace will be decorated with sparkling lights, spangled wreaths, Christmas trees and decorations.

### Bonnie Prince Charlie

Bonnie Prince Charlie brought the Palace to life in 1745, when he set up court for six weeks as he attempted to claim the British throne for his father. Visitors can explore the Great Gallery, which was used as the Prince's Audience Chamber during the day, and transformed in the evening for extravagant balls and receptions.

### Holyrood Abbey

Standing next to the Palace are the ruins of Holyrood Abbey, once one of the grandest medieval abbeys in Scotland. Founded in 1128 by King David I, the Abbey was enlarged over the centuries.

Go behind the ropes with an expert guide and learn about the Palace's important role as The King's official residence in Scotland, and the fascinating behind-the-scenes work that ensures the smooth running of Garden Parties, Investitures, audiences and receptions. This tour is the only opportunity to see the West Drawing Room, used by His Majesty and members of the Royal Family as a private sitting room.

The guided tour includes a visit to the Historic Apartments of Mary, Queen of Scots, which were home to Mary during some of the most dramatic events in her turbulent reign.

# WINDSOR CASTLE

Windsor Castle is the oldest and largest occupied castle in the world. Established in the 11th century by William the Conqueror, it has been remodelled by successive kings and queens. Today the Castle is used regularly for ceremonial and State occasions and has been the home of 40 monarchs.

## HIGHLIGHTS



### The State Apartments

A walk through the State Apartments takes visitors on a journey through 1,000 years of royal history, from the medieval origins of the Castle to the present day. Many of these magnificent rooms were built for Charles II and are today the setting for State and ceremonial occasions.

### St George's Chapel

St George's Chapel is one of the finest examples of Gothic architecture in England. It is the spiritual home of the Order of the Garter and the final resting place of 11 monarchs, including Henry VIII, Charles I and Queen Elizabeth II, as well as her husband Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

### Queen Mary's Dolls' House

The largest and most famous dolls' house in the world was built for Queen Mary, wife of King George V, by the leading British architect Sir Edwin Lutyens. The house has a fully stocked wine cellar, flushing toilets, running water and working lifts, and is filled with thousands of objects made by the leading artists, designers, craftspeople and manufacturers of the time.

*Please note that access to the Dolls' House may be limited on busy days and during planned closures.*

### Christmas

The Castle is decked with Christmas trees, garlands and twinkling lights for the festive season. This is a wonderful time of year to see Windsor, and a visit to the Castle is the perfect way for groups to celebrate.

During the winter months, visitors can also explore the richly decorated Semi-State Rooms, which were George IV's private apartments and are still used for official entertaining.
